



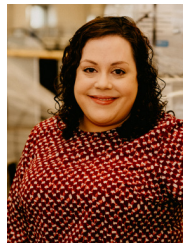

## Weekly Chop Shop Begins Again June 27th!

THI will officially start our 2023 Veggie Chop Shop season on Tuesday, June 27th! Please join in any way you can! There are Sign Ups for cooking and delivering food on Tuesdays, as well as gleaning on Wednesday evenings at the **Brown Deer Market** and Sunday afternoons at the **Fondy Farmers Market**.



We are extra excited about this summer because of the fact that Tikkun Ha-Ir was awarded a **\$50,000 Advancing a Healthier Wisconsin (AHW) Grant through the Medical College of Wisconsin!** Last summer we piloted weekly lunches to early childcare centers and will be expanding it. We are working closely with **Wisconsin Early**

**Childhood Association, (WECA)** to serve more children at more locations! Using the data we collect from our grants research team, we will analyze the feedback about lunches from a health perspective, since our overall goal of Veggie Chop Shop is not to just feed the community, but get more nutritious food to the community!

Since our staff has grown, so has our programming! In addition to monthly meals for **The Cathedral Center**, this year in the Veggie Chop Shop “off season” we partnered with **The Parenting Network** and made monthly meals for their Parent Cafes at **Hephatha Lutheran Church**.

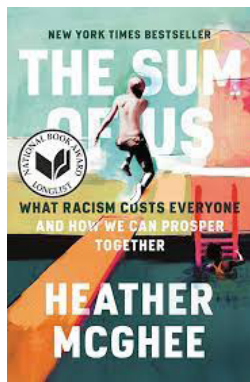

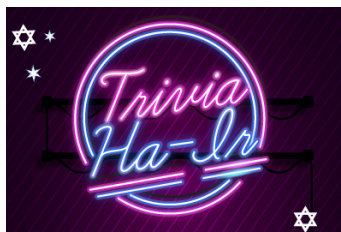


## 20th Anniversary
