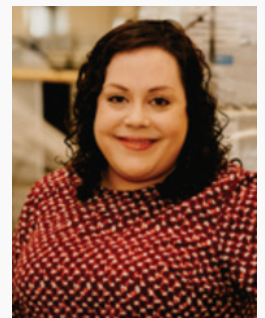

We're looking for volunteers Sundays thru Wednesdays from June 29th - Oct 12th.

You don't have to be a chef to feed the hungry.

When I think of spring, the first thing that comes to mind is the sprouting of new plants—the budding trees, the Crocus popping through the ground, and soon enough, Wisconsin's fresh produce will be available for Veggie Chop Shop! VCS is in its 3rd season in the kitchen at **All People's Gathering Church**, an essential resource in the community that provides pantry staples and fresh produce to those experiencing food insecurity.

Tikkun Ha-Ir's **VCS gleans over 500 pounds of produce to create over 1,000 meals a week!** We also provide additional produce directly to the community from the **JCC Community Pantry**. We welcome volunteers of all abilities, but please note that on Mondays, all volunteers must be 18 years or older. This is due to our partnership with the **Milwaukee Women's Correctional Center (MWCC)**, where volunteers participate in a community service program as part of their release plan. They gain important job-skills, make connections, and enjoy a delicious home-made lunch together after the volunteer shift!

We are excited to provide meals this year to **The Cathedral Center, Meta House, Pathfinders, and WECA partner childcare centers**. We'll also distribute smaller portions at the **Kinship Community Food Center and The Gathering Table** at All People's Gathering Church.

Please consider signing up to glean, chop veggies, or help deliver meals! **Your support makes a real difference.**

THI AWARDED MKE ECO OFFICE \$30K FEED GRANT

This fall, Tikkun Ha-Ir applied for the inaugural **FEED MKE Project Food Waste Reduction and Compost Grant**, funded by the USDA. We are proud to be one of only two recipients to receive the full award of **\$30,000 for food waste recovery**. With over 40 applicants, only thirteen agencies were awarded the FEED grant. THI has created a reputation for being reliable in regards to food waste recovery.

Through our ongoing gleaning efforts and meal programs, Veggie Chop Shop and Tikkun Ha-Ir’s food recovery initiatives have proven to be a valuable investment. This grant has enabled us to purchase a much-needed hitch and trailer, which will significantly improve our capacity each season. Our strong relationships with local producers and market managers have opened up more gleaning opportunities than we could previously manage. With this additional storage and continued partnership, we are now able to expand food recovery and donations across the city of Milwaukee.

THI TEAMS UP WITH THE JCRC FOR AN UPLIFTING INTERFAITH SEDER BY RHONDA LINDNER



On March 10th, 2025, Tikkun Ha-Ir and **the Jewish Community Relations Council** partnered to host a Wisconsin Community Interfaith Seder at **Congregation Beth Israel Ner Tamid**. It was an honor to have so many interfaith and community leaders attend to learn more about the Passover Seder and to discuss the many universal themes of the holiday. We read through a great amount of the Haggadah and then enjoyed a delicious meal by Hannah’s Catering.

The seder took months to plan, including creating our own Haggadah complete with the Passover liturgy and discussion questions to help engage all of our guests. In speaking with many attendees, I learned this seder was their first Passover experience, and that they felt extremely grateful for the opportunity to learn alongside such a diverse community of faith and lay leaders. Guests came from the following traditions: Bahá’i, Buddhism, Christianity, and Islam.



Nights like these fill me with hope and remind me how blessed we are to have each other. An attendee from my Voting Rights Coalition felt so revived and energized from the positivity in the room that she was moved to tears, sharing how in need she was for community during such challenging times.



MILWAUKEE'S GOOD DEEDS DAY SHOWCASES POWERFUL PARTNERSHIP AND PURPOSE

Good Deeds Day 2025 in Milwaukee was a shining example of the power of collaboration. On April 6th, Tikun Ha-Ir of Milwaukee, the Harry & Rose Samson Family Jewish Community Center, and the Jewish Community Relations Council of the Milwaukee Jewish Federation worked hand in hand to bring together people from all over MKE for a day of service and mitzvot. Thank you to Sarah DeNeve and the GDD Steering Committee for the dedicated months of planning!

Rooted in the shared Jewish values of chesed (loving kindness), kehillah (community), and tzedakah (thoughtful giving), Good Deeds Day brought together **over 250 volunteers** and **more than 25 organizations** in Milwaukee to make a lasting impact across our city. As part of a global movement celebrated by over 100 countries, we were honored to help facilitate the outpouring of generosity we saw from the community.

Together, we:

- Packed **500 hygiene kits** and **500 snack kits** for Pathfinders, Cathedral Center, and The Guest House;
- Made and delivered **1,000 sandwiches** for the Jewish Community Pantry and The Guest House;
- Created **50 warm blankets** for the Jewish Community Pantry and wrote **hundreds of handmade cards** to accompany the kits and gifts;
- Assembled **75 welcome home baskets** for Meta House and Pathfinders;
- Packed and distributed **385 Passover food bags** to families and individuals in need, thanks to QuickKosher;
- and **sorted clothing and organized supplies** at Repairers of the Breach, **crafted with veterans** at the Zablocki VA, **cleaned up the orchard** for All People's Church, and **cooked and served a fresh meal** to guests from Cathedral Center and Pathfinders.

From heartfelt service projects to a joyful community lunch, **Good Deeds Day 2025 was a reminder of what's possible when we work together.** Let's carry this spirit forward—all year long.

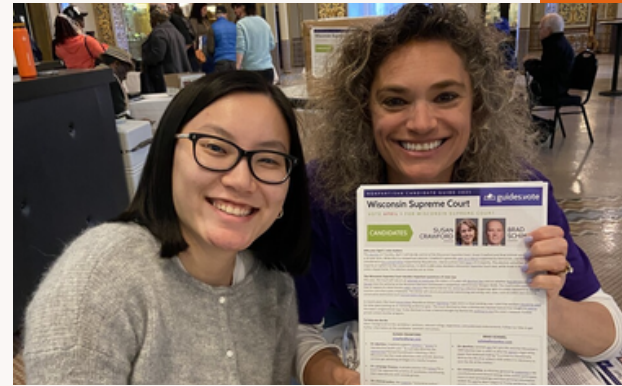


SPRING ELECTION

Thank you for your hard work and dedication to April’s Special Election! This election set a record in Milwaukee—**55% voter turnout!** Our goal is that **all** eligible voters feel an essential part of the system, and realize that **their vote is their voice.**

Special thanks to all our volunteers for their support of non-partisan efforts and their commitment to a democracy where every vote matters. In 2024, Nonprofit Power Report found that **voters engaged by non-partisan efforts saw a 10% point increase in voter turnout** compared to partisan efforts in the same communities—especially in low-income areas and among young voters, voters of color, and other historically marginalized groups.

We at THI are ready to work and bring more great opportunities to our volunteers! We will pursue avenues that bring us together rather than tear us apart. I have tremendous faith that THI will lead the way in Jewish community non-partisan efforts.



100 WOMEN ON THE MOVE



100 WOMEN ON THE MOVE continues to do incredible work in 2025. We celebrated our multi-faith and multi-racial coalition at a luncheon on January 22nd, and **Anita Johnson of Souls to the Polls** led us in our collective call to action. We were asked to work with our congregations, our neighborhood organizations, and our other networks to educate the public about the importance of voting in the April Special Election. We engaged youth voters, canvassed in low-propensity neighborhoods, and spoke passionately with our friends and family members. We proved our motto—**“When we vote, we win!”**

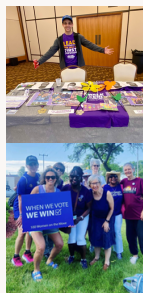
